

PERSPECTIVE

The Directorate General Factory Advice Service and Labour Institutes (DGFASLI), Mumbai is an attached office of the Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India to serve as a technical arm to assist the Ministry in formulating National Policies on Occupational Safety and Health and to advise the State Governments and Factories on matters concerning Safety, Health, Efficiency and well being of persons at work. It also enforces safety and health statutes in major Ports of the country.

The Regional Labour Institute, Chennai, is one of the Sub-ordinate Offices of DGFASLI, Government of India, Ministry of Labour and Employment, has been rendering Technical Assistance and service in the areas of work environment monitoring in the Southern Region. However, it is felt that Industries themselves should be equipped to regularly monitor their work environment and control the same. To achieve this, the Industries should get their personnel trained in Industrial Hygiene Techniques. This Training Programme is designed to help the Industries in this area.

Industrial workers in their day-to-day work are exposed to various kinds of health hazards. Many occupational disorders are caused due to the release of toxic gases, fumes, vapours, dusts, etc. from various processes to the work environment. Rapid industrialization has resulted in enormous increase in such problems. The practice of Industrial Hygiene requires assessment of hazards by periodical monitoring of the work environment.

The Amendments made to The Factories Act, 1948 have placed specific responsibilities on the Managements of the Industries to monitor the work place environment and control the hazards in order to keep the levels of the contaminants within permissible limits as prescribed under Second Schedule of the Factories Act, 1948 (as amended in 1987) and compliance of monitoring and controlling the hazards has been made mandatory on the part of the Managements under Section 41F of the Factories Act, 1948.

The practice of Industrial Hygiene as a speciality needs certain specific equipment and facilities for sampling and analyzing the pollutants in the work place air. Till such time, the Industries acquire these facilities; it will be possible to carry out the environmental monitoring using existing Laboratory facilities in the factories with the addition of a few instruments and training of the Laboratory Chemists.

OBJECTIVE

The objective of this training programme is to impart theoretical and practical training on Industrial Hygiene Techniques for assessment and abatement of various environmental hazards arising at the place of work. The training programme will be conducted in the form of Lectures followed by discussions, demonstration and Laboratory Exercises.
